### Message from the Director

The Louisiana State Register has <u>published</u> a revision to the Louisiana Physical Therapy Board Rules effective August 20, 2021. The Rule changes highlighted in this newsletter provide a summary of significant changes (pages 3—4). An updated PDF copy of the Practice Act and Rules is available on the <u>board website</u>.

In my position, I am the contact person responsible for questions related to the Practice Act and Rules. It is my job to direct licensees to where they can find the answer in the Practice Act or Rules. It is not my job to interpret the Practice Act or Rules for licensees. More often than not, the answer to the questions asked is based on the knowledge, skill, education, training and experience of the licensee and whether or not they are competent to perform the procedure. Physical therapists are responsible for managing all aspects of physical therapy care of each patient. The decisions that you make need to be in the best interest of the patients and clients that you serve. If a complaint is filed on your license, you will have the

## **CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE**

Judith Halverson, PT, Chairman of the Board

We are well into 2021, welcoming newly graduated physical therapists and physical therapist assistants who persevered through a tumultuous year. As a profession over this past year plus, we navigated changes in how we practiced, such as embracing telehealth, and the changing directives from our national, state and local leaders. I think about those we lost due to the pandemic. We look to the remainder of 2021 with hope that the health of our state, our nation, and the world will improve.

Your board has responded through this past year by adapting the delivery of our meetings and work, while continuing to meet the needs of the public and our licensees. In 2021, licensees renewing their license became the first to participate in the Minimum Data Set (MDS) survey. While the introduction of the survey came with its challenges, Board staff have learned from the experience and have already addressed necessary changes to make the process smoother moving forward. We appreciate all licensees' patience as we worked through these challenges and adapted.

As we continue to watch our state recover from the pandemic, we will look for ways that we can continue to improve our processes. Licensees may see future changes to their dashboards as new features are introduced to further streamline work and bring convenience to your fingertips. We always encourage feedback on our website. Licensees should always feel free to share feedback or ideas with staff.

Licensees responded with enthusiasm and positive feedback to the Jurisprudence requirement provided via Zoom. Given this positive response, the Board is excited to continue to offer opportunities to complete the Jurisprudence requirement via Zoom. Offering a safe alternative to the traditional traveling live jurisprudence met the needs of our licensees and ensured the safety of our Board staff, and we even saw our attendance grow! Board meetings were also held using Zoom. The pandemic shined a spotlight on the issue of accessibility and the Board does not wish to hinder the participation of the public and licensees in these matters.

## A Common Misconception

#### Ouestion:

Must a licensee who is providing services on a cash pay basis follow the Louisiana Physical Therapy Board Practice Act & Rules?

#### Answer:

Yes, all licensed PTs and PTAs in Louisiana must follow and comply with the Practice Act and Rules. The manner in which a provider receives payment for service (cash, insurance, attorney, etc.) does not exempt the provider from compliance with the Practice Act and Rules.

A new normal can be a good thing. More exciting changes are on the horizon. As you read this newsletter, you'll find a breakdown of the most significant rules changes. The Board is confident that these changes will provide for more clarity in the practice of physical therapy in Louisiana and reduce the burden of previous inefficiencies. As always, I encourage licensees to reach out to Board staff whenever you have questions or concerns. Staff will work diligently to address your concerns within a timely manner and to the best of their abilities.

## **Rules Changes for 2021**

Here is a summary of significant Rule changes that take effect on August 20, 2021. This is not a comprehensive review of all rule changes. A comprehensive view of all Rule changes can be accessed in the <u>Louisiana State Register</u>.

An updated PDF copy of the Practice Act and Rules is available on the board website.

### Applicants for Licensure

- Paperless. Rule change allows the Board to transition to completely paperless licensure applications.
- Exam Eligibility. Rule change allows applicants for the National Physical Therapy Exam may be made eligible as soon as the day after they register for the exam through the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT).
- Six Attempts to Pass the NPTE. Louisiana's NPTE limitations on examination are increased to six from four to align with the FSBPT's limitations.

### Continuing Education Requirements & Practice

- Traditional/Live Coursework is no longer mandated. Rule change removes the requirement to take live/traditional continuing education for licensure renewal. Licensees may still take live coursework, but they are no longer required to do so.
- Administrative Coursework Hours are no longer limited to 8 hours.
   Rule change removes the limitation on administrative courses that
   can be counted toward licensure renewal. The biennial
   requirements for renewal are now as follows: 2 hours of
   Jurisprudence, 2 hours of Ethics and 26 hours of clinical and/or
   administrative for a total of 30 hours of continuing education hours.
- More approved activities for obtaining CEU credit. Licensees may now obtain up to 10 hours of CEU credit for teaching in a CAPTEaccredited program and up to 5 hours for serving in elected or appointed positions of national or state physical therapy organizations.

## **RULE CHANGES 2021**

### Treatment with Dry Needling

- Reduced from 50 to 25 Coursework Hours required. The number of required board-approved in-person contact hours changes from 50 to 25.
- Students may take Dry Needling coursework prior to graduating. PT students who have completed the requirements in §311.B are allowed to practice dry needling under continuous supervision. \*\*IMPORTANT\*\* Coursework completed must be board-approved continuing education and not a part of PT program curriculum.

#### Supervision

- More licensees qualify to supervise foreign-educated licensees. Removed the number of years of experience a licensee is required to have prior to serving as a clinical supervisor of foreign-educated licensees.
- PTAs may work in home health and education sooner.
  Removed the one-year of supervised work experience required prior to PTAs working in a school or home health setting. \*\*\*IMPORTANT\*\*\* There may be other rules and laws that maintain this restriction that govern the practice of PTAs in these settings.
- Allow for a customized approach to assessing competence of licensees re-entering the practice. Changed certain requirements for re-entry to practice after being out of the practice for four years or more.

## School-based Workplace Setting Rules

School setting language added in Rule. Early childhood services language was in Rule, but this language is not appropriate for school-based services for children age 3-22.

### **Documentation Standards**

• **Signature Stamps.** Signature stamps may be used in lieu of written signature.

# Christopher Blackstone, License No. 05051, Baton Rouge, LA Administrative Complaint 2021-I-003

On December 18, 2020, a bill of information was filed against physical therapist on the charge of conspiracy to commit health care fraud, a felony. Physical therapist pled guilty to said allegations on 2/24/2021. Charges of conspiracy to commit health care fraud are pending in the US District Court for the Eastern District of La. Effective April 14, 2021, physical therapist is indefinitely suspended while this interim consent agreement is in effect and precluded from practicing physical therapy in any capacity.

# Chasity Popillion, PT License No.09186, Lafayette, LA. Administrative Complaint 2020-I-019

Physical Therapist provided physical therapy services to a patient which were inappropriate for patient's condition and documented services which were not provided as documented, which caused billing for services that were not performed. Licensee is placed on probation for a minimum of two (2) years. During the probationary period, licensee is subject to monitoring visits. The employers, direct supervisors and all co-worker must review and acknowledge licensee's Consent Order.

# Christian Stafford, PT. License No. 08847, New Orleans, LA. Administrative Complaint 2020-I-017

Physical Therapist documented for services that were not performed, which caused billing for services to the physical therapy patient that were not performed, including procedures requiring one-on-one supervision. Licensee is placed on probation for a minimum of two (2) years. During the probationary period, licensee is subject to monitoring visits. The employers, direct supervisors and all co-workers must review and acknowledge licensee's Consent Order.
